C2C Students & DOR Services

<u>College</u>

SDCCD has three (3) for-credit Colleges, and six (6) non-credit locations with a multitude of training options.

Each campus has their own personality, culture, programs, and protocols.

C2C helps students understand how to work with each campus.

C2C assists students with deciding which campus to attend based on Job Title, Training Program, and Location.

Training programs must be aligned with the approved DOR Employment Goal.

DOR will only pay for classes required under the approved Education Plan.

C2C works with students to decide what level of training - Certificate or Associates.

Students meet with the Disability Support Program & Serves (DSPS) counselor every semester to make sure they are on track with training requirements (Ed plan).

DOR has strict rules on when to submit requests for funding, and what documentation is required.

If students are required tuition, fees, & supply funding from DOR they must first apply to Financial Aid (FASFA) every year.

Career

C2C works with students to determine what Job Title they are interested and capable of pursuing.

DOR then develops an Individualized Plan for Employment (PE) which guides all C2C/DOR Services.

All C2C educational services and vocational supports must be aligned with the approved DOR training and employment goals.

Training programs must be aligned with the approved DOR Employment Goal.

Over a 3-year scope of services, C2C assists students with utilizing education as a pathway to employment.

Each year coincides with activities and requirements that help students take active steps toward employment.

The ultimate goal of C2C services is to assist students with obtaining Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE)

CIE means searching, applying, and interviewing for jobs just like any other job seeker in the competitive market.
