

Title IX Intercollege Sports Interest Survey Mesa College, Fall 2022

October 7, 2022

Background

The data in this report was collected by the San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) in accordance with the Title IX Equal Opportunity in Education Act to determine applicants' level of interest in intercollegiate athletics and whether the colleges are fulfilling the expressed demand of their applicants for opportunities to participate in sports. Data was collected from applicants who completed CCCApply in January through September of 2022 in an optional survey included in the application.

The sports listed in Table 1 are offered to student athletes at Mesa College.



Respondents' Interest in Intercollegiate Athletics


Of the 932 respondents to the survey in CCCApply, 590 indicated they were interested in competing in intercollegiate sports (63%). 279 of these were **female** (47% of those interested in competing) and 311 of these were **male** (53% of those interested in competing). Of those who indicated they were interested, 549 students provided email addresses to be contacted about intercollegiate sports at Mesa College (female: 254, male: 295).

Female Applicants' Responses

When female applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in volleyball (n=88) and soccer (n=75), which are both offered at Mesa College. Not shown, 16 applicants expressed interest in cross country.




The sport not currently offered at Mesa College for which the largest number of respondents expressed interest was tennis (n=39), with 30 respondents indicating they were beginners



Male Applicants' Responses

When male applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in football (n=88) and soccer (n=83), both of which are offered at Mesa College. Not shown, 14 applicants expressed interest in water polo and cross country.



The sport not currently offered at Mesa College for which the most respondents expressed interest was tennis, with the largest group of those applicants indicating they were intermediate (n=15).
