



Title IX Intercollegiate Sports Interest Survey

Miramar College, Fall 2022

Background

The data in this report was collected by the San Diego Community College District (SDCCD) in accordance with the Title IX Equal Opportunity in Education Act to determine applicants' level of interest in intercollegiate athletics and whether the colleges are fulfilling the expressed demand of their applicants for opportunities to participate in sports. Data was collected from applicants who completed CCCApply in January through September of 2022 in an optional survey included in the application.

The sports listed in Table 1 are offered to student athletes at Miramar College.

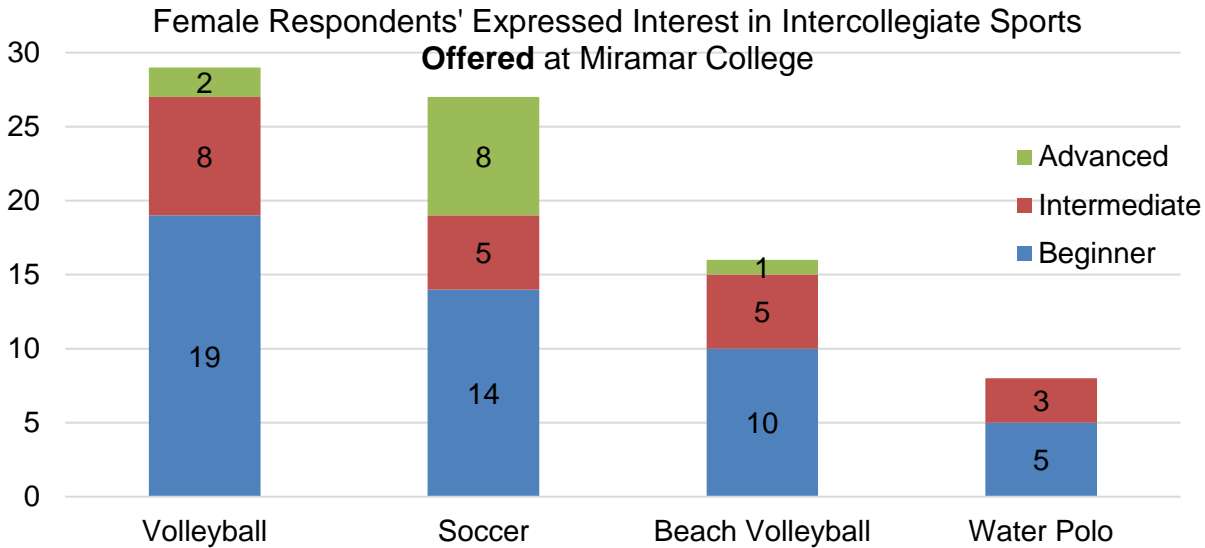
Respondents' Interest in Intercollegiate Athletics

Of the 605 respondents to the survey in CCCApply, 335 indicated they were interested in competing in intercollegiate sports (55%). 129 of these were **female (39%** of those interested in competing) and 206 of these were **male (61%** of those interested in competing). Of those who indicated they were interested, 296 students provided email addresses to be contacted about intercollegiate sports at Miramar College (female: 113, male: 183).

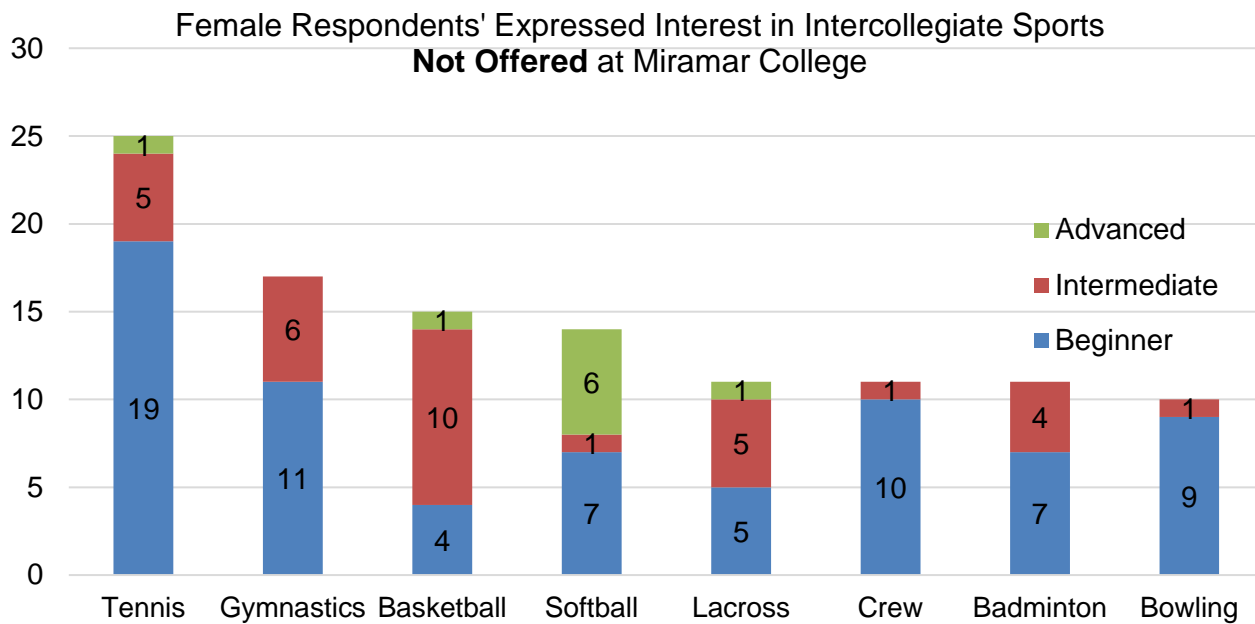

Female Applicants' Responses

When female applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in volleyball (n=29), which is offered at Miramar. The majority of these respondents indicated they were beginners (19), and 10 indicated they were intermediate or advanced. 27 respondents indicated they are interested in soccer, which is offered at Miramar college.



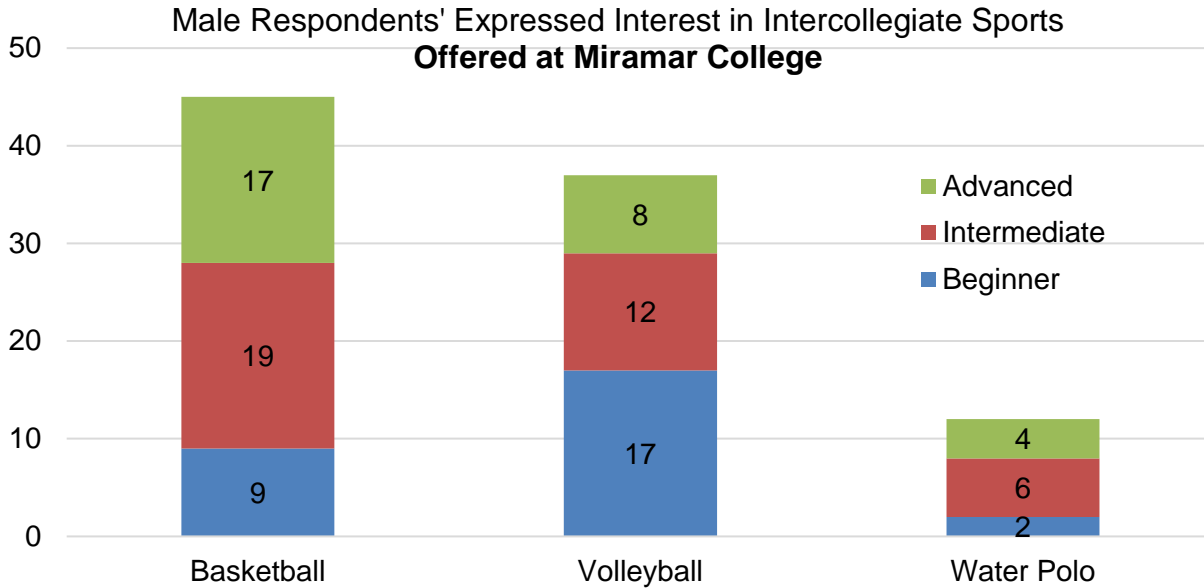
25 respondents indicated they would be interested in tennis, and another 17 indicated they would be interested in gymnastics (neither of which is offered at Miramar College). 15 indicated interest in basketball (not offered), with 11 of these respondents indicating they are intermediate or advanced.

Male Applicants' Responses

45 male applicants indicated interested in basketball and 37 indicated interest in volleyball, which are offered at Miramar.



When male applicants indicated that they would be interested in competing in a sport, they most commonly expressed interest in soccer (n=57), which is not offered at Miramar. A majority of these respondents indicated they were intermediate or advanced (49). Other sports not offered at Miramar which received high levels of interest were football (n=39) and baseball (n=35).
