REQUISITES:

Advisory: Computer Business Technology 94 or Computer Business Technology 101, and Computer Business Technology 120, each with a grade of "C" or better, or equivalent.

This intermediate-level course introduces advanced features and text editing tools of Microsoft Word. Students create reference documents, online forms and newsletters. Topics include the use of macros and collaboration and integration tools. This course is designed for students intending to use Microsoft Word for academic, professional and/or personal purposes.

**48 - 54 hours lecture, 3 units
Letter Grade or Pass/No Pass Option**

REQUISITES:

Limitation on Enrollment: This course is not open to students with previous credit for Speech 99.

The course provides instruction and practice in American English vocal standards and communication skills. Topics include American English standards of pronunciation, listening comprehension, ear-training techniques, effective use of vocal variables of voice-rate, pitch force and quality, vocabulary building, conversation with correct use of grammar, sentence structures, common American idioms, pronunciation, and reading. This course is intended for non-native speakers of English who want to learn and practice American English vocal standards.
