College Productivity Report - Fall 2010 As of First Census

Purpose

This report has been prepared in order to provide four productivity indicators for City, Mesa and Miramar Colleges for the last four fall terms including Fall 2010.

FTES/FTEF Ratio

FTES and FTEF data only include census week sections. As a point of reference, for a census week class, an FTES/FTEF ratio of 15 would equate to a class size of approximately 30 students.

• Mesa College showed an improvement in the FTES/FTEF ratio in Fall 2010 compared to the three previous terms. The District benchmark (based on the average of the reported four Fall terms) is 16.6. For Fall 2010, the average class size for each college was as follows: City 36.2, Mesa 35.0, Miramar 35.1, and District 35.4.

Yields

Data were used from first census to calculate the yields. Yields are calculated by taking the total amount of FTES and dividing by the total number of related sections. For example, if the total FTES were 24.83 and there were 5 related sections, the resulting yield would be 4.96.

• The yields at City and Mesa Colleges showed improvement in almost all accounting methods in Fall 2010 compared to the previous fall term (see Table 2).

Load

Data were used from first census to calculate the Loads. Load is the ratio of Weekly Student Contact Hours (WSCH) to Full-time Equivalent Faculty (WSCH/FTEF) and is a measure of productivity. The statewide Load benchmark for a 17.5 week semester is 525. The Load benchmark for SDCCD's 16.5 semester is 557.

• The load values for Fall 2010 were greater than or equal to the loads for the previous three fall terms at Mesa and Miramar Colleges.

Enrollment and Fill Rate

The capacity and enrollment data were used to analyze fill rates. Data were as of first census and were used for all four terms. Enrollment as of census was divided by the course capacity to calculate fill rates. As a point of reference, if there are 25 students in a class with a cap of 40, the fill rate would be 0.63.

• The overall fill rates for Fall 2010 were greater than or equal to the fill rates for the previous three fall terms at City and Mesa Colleges.
