## INTRODUCTION

This report is intended to provide information regarding Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSPS) students and their course-taking behaviors. The data for this report are generated by SDCCD Information Systems. Student demographics and characteristics, course completion, and vocational course headcounts are provided separately for each primary term (fall and spring) in the 2007-08 academic year. FTES and course success and retention are calculated for the entire academic year. This report also includes benchmarks that may be used as a point of reference, including averages for the DSPS student population and all student population. Please note that student demographics and characteristics are measured prior to Census Day, while student outcomes and vocational course headcounts are measured past Census Day.

Several of the measures used in this report warrant description.

- The *College* variable indicates the primary college of the student. Primary college refers to the college at which the majority of the units are being taken for the term.
- *Retention Rate* The percentage of students who complete a course with a grade of A, B, C, D, F, CR, NC, or I out of total census enrollments.
- Success Rate The percentage of students who complete a course with a grade of A, B, C, or CR out of total census enrollments.
- FTES Total number of full time equivalent students enrolled at first census.
- DSPS special classes Classes with 50% or greater DSPS-identified student enrollment.
