Spring 2003 ClassTalk Survey Results (n=2,263)

The objective of this survey was to obtain more information about new students. Nine questions were included in the survey. A total of 2,263 students (about 5% of the total student population) responded districtwide. Results showed very little differences between City, Mesa, and Miramar colleges. Following is a brief summary of the districtwide results:

- Students indicated that college's reputation and distance to work/home attracted them the most to the college. Low tuition was also another important factor that contributed to students' decision of enrollment at the college.
- Students perceived that classes offered at convenient times and quality of instruction were most important to them.
- For students who intended to transfer, UC and CSU were top transfer destinations.
- Districtwide, nearly 30% of the students stated that they would be able to complete college only if they receive financial aid. Another 28% of the students felt that they would have sufficient funds to complete college.
- Over 50% of the students indicated that their friends were extremely supportive of their attending this college.
- Over 60% of the students reported that their families were extremely supportive of their attending this college.
- Students claimed that work demands and lack of finances were important issues that would force them to withdraw.
- More than 20% of the students felt that they need special tutoring or remedial work in Mathematics. Another 46% of the students indicated that they did not need any special tutoring or remedial work.
- About 39% of the students identified themselves primarily as students who were employed. Another 22% viewed themselves primarily as employees who were going to college.
